Upon arrival, Motor Vehicle will be required to be tested for certification to New Zealand Compliance Standards. Motor Vehicles must be steam-cleaned prior to shipment. To prevent the importer having to pay unnecessary and irrecoverable storage costs in the intervening period, Customs will release the goods, in the absence of the owner, to a nominee appointed by the owner, provided that the following requirements are met:</p> <p>A nominee (friend, relative, agent, etc.) of the owner must apply to Customs at the port in New Zealand where the goods or vehicle will arrive, to arrange for Customs clearance. The nominee will need to produce:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (a) documentary evidence of authority to act for the owner. • (b) documentary evidence to show that the owner is taking up permanent residence in New Zealand for the first time, or in the case of a returning resident, has been living abroad for not less than 21 months. <p>The nominee will then be required to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (a) complete a Customs sight entry and lodge it with customs. • (b) pay Customs a cash deposit equal to the full amount of Customs charges that would normally be payable on the vehicle or goods. <p>When the owner arrives in New Zealand the deposit will be refunded provided all the conditions governing concessionary entry can be met at that time.</p>
